The Liberia International Christian College is a faith project. ULICAF embarked on the establishment of a Christian Liberal Arts college in Liberia West Africa with no money in the bank for such huge undertaking. By faith we stepped out of our comfort zone, beyond our financial means to develop this Christ-centered college to train, equip and empower the next generation of leaders for Liberia after a brutal civil war and EBOLA epidemic.

This has been our operating motto over the years. As we stepped out in faith, God who is always in motion has been faithful in providing the funds we stand in need of to keep the work in Liberia moving forward.

PANIC, PRAYER AND TRIUMPH!

The last two weeks in July were very challenging. The government of Liberia denied LICC of subsidy that the college had benefited from in the past and was hoping to receive it to help cover 5 months of payroll arrears and other administrative cost. **PANIC:** The Board of Trustees and the Administration of the college jointly informed ULICAF that the reopening of the school would be delayed and subsequently closed for a semester to figure a way to generate funds to pay the salary arrears. **PRAYER:** ULICAF's board prayed and discussed the need of the college and as the information was, it got shared with you our friends and prayer partners in early August. We all prayed and allowed God to use us to keep the doors of the college opened. **TRIUMPH:** Praise God that through your prayers and generous giving to ULICAF and its initiative, LICC in Liberia, the Fall semester has started with 149 students being trained, equipped and empowered to impact churches and the country of Liberia. Secondly, the goal to raise enough money to furnish the dorms completed in June at LICC for students was met.

A visit with Ms. Janet Edgecomb

Janet Edgecomb extend here greetings to you all and encourages us to continue the services God has called us to...

Ms. Edgecomb was born to the union of Louis and Heidi Edgecomb in 1929. At the age of 27, in 1956, she went to Liberia as a missionary with Worldwide Evangelization Crusade, WEC, where she lived and served the Lord with United Liberia Inland Church for 40 years. Her love for the Dan tribe she worked with compelled her to learn to speak and write the dan dialect. She was one of the founding members of ULICAF and a board member for ten years. Ms. Edgecomb is now living in the Good Samaritan Home, a nursing facility in Quincy, IL. At 90 years of age, she still writes the dan dialect and speaks it fluently. She conducts a Bible study at a jail facility in Quincy where many have come to Christ.



PRAYER NEED: It has become very clear to us that it is unrealistic to expect a Christian college in the third poorest county of the world to become self-sustainable. The challenge before us is that the government of Liberia does not have money to grant subsidy to LICC in the years to come. Please prayerfully consider intentionally giving so that the college continues to maintain the subsidized, reduced tuition being charged, \$10/credit hour and toward the LICC operation funds.
