The 4th graduation ceremony of LICC took place over the weekend of Friday July 1st beginning with the banquet, then baccalaureate service on Saturday, and the graduation on Sunday.

The guest speaker for the banquet service was Mahmud Johnson, who completed a BA in Economics at Dartmouth college in 2013, and went on to work with smallholder farmers through a USAID program. He also served as a Senior Economic Analyst with Aurora Solutions, Inc. in Monrovia.

On Saturday, the baccalaureate speaker was a familiar face to the LICC students and faculty. Bishop Leaid Zeoye spoke on the importance of being connected to Jesus.

On Sunday there were 124 graduates: 42 in Agriculture, 9 in Theology, 38 in Education, and 36 in Business.

This was the very first graduating class for the Department of Agriculture. The top student in the entire school, Emmanuel Wuo, graduated with the highest grade point average of 3.98 from the Agriculture Department.
